16. Build traffic with SEO (Yoast), optimize your content

FAQ

How much does it cost to create a website?

The cost varies widely based on features and design—ranging from free (using basic website builders) to several thousand euros for custom sites. Budget options work for personal use or small businesses, while custom builds suit larger or growing businesses.

Do I need to know how to code to build a website?

No, you can use website builders like Wix, Squarespace, or WordPress with drag-and-drop tools. However, basic coding knowledge helps if you want more control and customization.

What pages should my website have?

At minimum, include a homepage, about page, services or products page, and a contact page. Add blog, FAQ, or portfolio pages if they help communicate your value or improve customer experience.
